Friends of Forest Park "Forest Park Conservancy Community Outreach"	\$2,750	The project develops an outreach brochure as an education and outreach tool, engages 6 neighborhood associations bordering Forest Park, and includes a bookmark identifying community resources with information about neighborhood associations. The Grant will fund printing 5000 brochures and \$500 toward the NW Examiner distribution fee.
Goose Hollow Family Shelter "Goose Hollow Family Shelter Website Project"	\$2,500	The website will allow the GHFS to communicate with friends, volunteers, and donors of the shelter electronically; forge new volunteers and relationships with neighborhoods and community organizations; and foster more community awareness and engagement. The Grant funds \$1500 for Equipment & Supplies and \$1000 toward web development costs.
Hillside Neighborhood Association "Hillside NA Listserve and Mailing"	\$1,060	The project creates themed, commercial quality mail serve lists to increase timely communication with neighbors to improve attendance and participation at NA activities. The mailing will notify households to the presence and location of NA website and email list serve. Grant funds Constant Contact list serves for three years and a one-time mailing to 700 households.
Linnton Community Center "Signs & Communication"	\$ 900	The project places a signs and community flower gardens where each lane enters St. Helens Rd; signs identify each historic enclave and provide space to announce community center activities; encourage volunteers from Hispanic and diverse groups engaged in community center activities to maintain gardens and announce their events. Grant funds 6 signs.
Northwest Portland Ministries "2008 NW Neighborhoods Senior Survey Project"	\$3,947	The project identifies and surveys at least 250 seniors to determine needs and interests around community resources; disseminate information about community resources and activities; and support registry in the Voluntary Emergency Registry if needed. Grant funds additional staff time to create & coordinate survey; volunteer training costs; (15) \$100 volunteer stipends & \$97 toward refreshments at events.
<b>Old Town-Chinatown Business Association*</b> <b>"Asian Night Market"</b>	<b>\$3,000</b>	<b>The project coordinates an Asian Night Market on NW Davis in August coordinated with the 2008 Beijing Olympics; host up to 100 vendors of Asian goods, produces, art &amp; crafts; shows diverse heritage of OTCT; draw many people from diverse backgrounds into neighborhood. Grant funds event related expenses &amp; \$1000 toward website event outreach.</b>

<b>Old Town-Chinatown Neighborhood Association*</b> <b>“Reaching Everyone in Old Town Chinatown”</b>	<b>\$3,400</b>	<b>The project expands the existing Crier, neighborhood newsletter, from 8 to 12 pages with sections about news, arts, services, events, shopping, dining, &amp; living in OTCT. Project also initiates a new outreach campaign, conducting surveys &amp; contests at events like happy hour dining, marching in Autumn Moon Festival parade. Grant funds Crier printing &amp; delivery, outreach materials &amp; small administration fee.</b>
Orlo “Art Boxes”	\$3,550	Project develops “Art Boxes” to hold and distribute an environmental art magazine by converting traditional-style boxes into a unique piece of public art reflecting a neighborhood theme. Provides neighborhood beautification & coalition and Orlo exposure daily. Grant funds 5 boxes costing \$710 per box.
Portland Downtown Neighborhood Association “2008 National Night Out”	\$ 445	The project increase capacity to reach the neighborhood and increase participation in the neighborhood National Night Out event with goals to increase membership and benefit partner community organizations. Grant funds provide resources for printing, outreach and event related expenses.
