Neighborhood Small Grant	Ecotrust	Sundown at Ecotrust	\$1,500.00	Community concert series held Thursday evenings in June and July, transforming the parking lot of the Jean Vollum Natural Capital Center to raise awareness of Ecotrust's mission and programmatic work while engaging like-minded organizations and businesses. Provides vibrant, community-oriented space that connects diverse audiences with their mission. Lessens the environmental impact of local events.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Friendly House	Community Outreach & Engagement Project	\$1,200.00	Provides vibrant, community-oriented space by transforming the parking lot of the Jean Vollum Natural Capital Center to host a summer concert series on Thursday evenings in June and July 2011.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Linnton Neighborhood Association	Bridging the Hills	\$500.00	Host summer social events with surveys throughout the neighborhood to promote neighborhood connectivity and participation. Provides leadership roles for local young people to increase youth involvement.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Macdonald Center	Building Community in Old Town Chinatown	\$1,100.00	Hosts community meetings in 2011 to bring together low-income adults and seniors to break down social isolation, build community, develop leadership skills and develop a sense of pride in where they live. Marks the day that President Roosevelt signed an executive order that led to the incarceration of Japanese Americans during WWII. Organizers will invite local high school students. Guest speaker: George Takei.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Sisters Of The Road	Empowered Voices Media Project (EVMP)	\$1,500.00	Train Sisters' community members – people with experience of homelessness – in creating digital media. Participants will produce short video projects that share real life experiences and act to dispel stereotypes about people experiencing homelessness.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Sylvan-Highlands Neighborhood Association	Neighborhood Coalition & Communications with Outreach Events	\$1,000.00	Build a communication bridge with bordering neighborhood, Arlington Heights, by hosting social events over the 2011 calendar year.
Neighborhood Small Grant	Zimmerman Community Center	Welcome Ramona	\$1,020.00	Host a block party welcoming the residents of the Ramona Apartments to the Pearl District and to celebrate the opening of the Zimmerman Community Center. The Ramona is the first affordable Pearl District apartment building to have mostly 2 and 3 bedroom units for families. Includes facilitated conversations that bring people together to identify and prioritize ZCC program needs.
